

- No neon, fluorescent or high intensity colors allowed. Black tones removed from proposed "approved" list.
- Over 1000 colors on "approved" list, with slightly over 500 on "limited" list limited to 5-15% of building façade area.
- Existing colors grandfathered unless *any* color changed on building (repainting allowed for maintenance).

- What a developer/commercial building owner would experience:
  - color palette review will be part of building plan review (for new projects; no addl. review time); or
  - submit color sample for staff review (for remodel or maintenance projects; goal: 24hr. response)
  - no additional fees
  - administrative review
  - appeal process (Design Review Board P&Z -Council)



#### • Pros:

- higher quality aesthetics for commercial buildings
- encourage community pride
- higher property values
- no Sherwin Williams colors are prohibited, only limited
- simple color-matching system

#### Cons:

- color may be more subjective than other building choices
- staff time spent on review



## **Options:**

- 1. move forward with commercial color palette
- 2. place commercial color palette to side for now; suggest modifications
- 3. cease work on commercial color palette
