Staff Recommendation

(ranked by staff recommendation; combination could be pursued)

- 1. Pursue adding athletic fields to BRAC
- 2. Pursue improving fields at BRAC a. possibly improve/add athletic fields to other parks

Notes:

- 1. "Pursue" means determine cost estimates (construction and O&M), further site review, and return with a recommendation to the Parks & Recreation Advisory Board and the City Council
 - i. Consider creating a Master Plan prepared by a consultant
- 2. Funding options to be considered including proposed HOT revenue bracketed legislation

Options and Next Steps

Options:

- a) Pursue <u>adding</u> athletic fields to specific existing parks i.e. BRAC, Sadie Thomas, Bonham, Cherry, Edgewater
- b) Pursue **improvements to** specific fields (identified in PIP)
- c) Pursue a combination of the above
- d) Pursue a "Super Park"
- e) Do not pursue changes, improvements, additions, etc.
- f) Other?

February/March 2015:

- Engage consultant for a Master Plan (e.g., BRAC)
- Or identify sites and funding source(s)

• April/May 2015:

- Update the Parks & Recreation Advisory Board (recommendation)
- Update the City Council (direction/action)

• Dec. 23, 2013: RFQ released for Design/Build

• **Feb. 7, 2014**: SOQ deadline

• Feb. 7-26, 2014: Committee reviews SOQ and site visits

• March 18, 2014: Parks & Rec Board updated

• March 20, 2014: Committee selects Grindline as Design/Build

• April 15, 2014: Parks & Rec Board unanimously recommends Grindline

• May 27, 2014: Council unanimously approves Grindline contract

- Sue Haswell Park (Lions Baseball Field area, which results in removal of a baseball field)

History cont.

• Decision Points:

- 1. Cost
- 2. Use existing facilities (reduces costs)
- 3. Complement existing facilities (add amenities to a park)
- 4. Provide an improved park amenity (replacement)
- 5. Add an artistic element
- 6. Minimal park maintenance
- 7. Remove Williamson Park modular skate park elements (end of life; repairs <u>not</u> recommended)

Note:

• Preferred site: a site where funds can be dedicated to skate park elements and <u>not</u> other amenities (i.e., parking, restrooms, etc.)








Sam Rayburn Middle School site

Note: elements could be similar to those proposed for the Williamson Park site (smaller scale)



Staff Recommendation

- Remove certain sites from consideration
 - a. Remove
 - 1) Sam Rayburn Middle School site
 - i. The Parks & Rec Advisory Board kept as a possible site
 - 2) Copperfield Drive site
 - i. The Parks & Rec Advisory Board recommended removing this site from consideration

b. Pursue

- 1) Williamson Park (existing site; a replacement)
- 2) Sue Haswell Park (Lions Field area lose a field)
 - i. Change name of Haswell Field to Lions Field
- Note: Staff recommendation next steps include:
- Committee Review
- Public Meeting(s)

Options and Next Steps for Skate Parks

• Options:

- a) Pursue sites recommended by the Parks & Rec Advisory Board
- b) Pursue City staff recommendation (Remove another site from consideration)
- c) Pursue sites recommended by the Parks & Rec Advisory Board **plus** the Copperfield Drive site
- d) Add certain sites for considerationa) e.g., Highway 6 between Briarcrest Dr. and University Dr.
 - i. Private property considerations
- e) Other? (e.g., do not pursue new skate parks)

• January/February 2015:

- Skate Parks Committee meetings
- Public meeting(s)

March/April 2015:

- Update the Parks & Recreation Advisory Board (recommendation)
- Update the City Council (direction)
- Spring/Summer 2015: Design and begin construction
