Staff Analysis & Recommendation \*

Staff recommends approval of the Lubrizol Specialty Products, Inc., Tax Abatement Agreement and Chapter 380 Economic Development Program Agreement. This proposed agreement implements the expansion of Lubrizol Specialty Products, Inc. and meets the strategic initiatives of creating new jobs and helping existing business to expand.

This project will allow a business that has thrived and outgrown its current building space the opportunity to expand and invest in the community. In addition, the City of Bryan is given the opportunity to retain a business that, without this type of assistance, could possibly be hindered in its growth in terms of new employment positions and expanded facilities. Approval of the proposed agreement, and authorizing the Mayor to execute it, will not only aid in the creation of 24 new jobs at an existing business, but also encourage investment within the Brazos County Industrial Park.
