


What is the Center for Alternative Learning (CAL)?

- Timber Academy
- Disciplinary Alternative Educational Placements (DAEP)
 - Venture Center 7th to 12th grades
 - LEAP 6 yr olds to 6th grade



Timber Academy

- Opened in 1994
- Alternative School with a self-paced curriculum
- Became the district's Dropout Recovery program

Timber Academy High School

- Worked to overcome negative "alternative" label
 - Changed name in 2011
 - Moved from 4 hour program to a 7 period day
 - Increased Rigor of self-paced instruction
 - Added Art and Horticulture
 - Added some Face-to-Face instruction in EOC





Timber Academy High School

- Timber is **NOT**
 - A discipline school
 - A place to get a GED
- Timber <u>IS</u>
 - A small campus founded on Relationships

Why Change?

- Space
 - 40-50 students at a time
 - No Dining, No PE facility
- Increased Opportunities

"We believe that there are other students walking the halls of our comprehensive high schools who would benefit from a small-school environment centered on relationships who don't need all the traditional activities"

What was the Vision for this new facility?

When the bond was <u>advertised to the public</u> and when the project was <u>taken to the Board</u> for the GMP, the following was shared

The vision of CSISD is to increase the student capacity of TAHS and to be able to market it to the general high school population in order to provide an alternative to the traditional high school experience.

Along with a new facility, the district will have the opportunity to rebrand TAHS (and perhaps even change its name) to a school of choice that provides academic rigor, excellent instructional experiences and customized learning.

Designing the Facility

- \$15.5 Million facility authorized by the voters in November 2013
- Designed to house three programs
 - LEAP
 - Venture
 - CSISD's Choice High School
- Under one roof with separation of programs

Designing the Facility

- Serve 150-200 high school students
- Self Sufficient
 - Own kitchen and dining
 - Indoor PE area
- More Curricular Opportunities
 - Science Lab space
 - Art studio
 - Collaboration space

How will we transition from TAHS to CVHS?

- CVHS will open in 2016-17
 - Cohort of 9th and 10th graders
 - "Traditional Timber" students
- CVHS will add a grade level for the next two years

What will happen to our Dropout Recovery Program?

- None of the traditional Timber students are being kicked out
- Dropout Recovery Design Team
 - Comprehensive High Schools
 - College View High Schools
 - Night School
- Choice in Dropout Recovery as well


