We, the Speakers and Presidents of the Faculty Senates/Councils of the Texas A&M University System, collectively believe that compelling employees to share confidential health information protected by law under HIPAA with a third party, for-profit vendor, is fundamentally wrong and violates principles of protection of private information of the employees.

Be it RESOLVED, that Speakers and Presidents of the Faculty Senates/Councils of the Texas A&M University System call upon the Texas A&M University System Health Care Plan to remove the new requirement for completion of the MyEvive Health Assessment in order to receive credit for the Wellness Premium Incentive.
