Summary:

As discussed in executive session of a previous meeting of the City Council, the City of Bryan Legal Department and BTU staff have been working with an outside law firm regarding potential litigation resulting from performance of a contract with Frontier Communications.

Staff Analysis and Recommendation:

The BTU Board of Directors have reviewed the potential litigation issue and recommend the City Council approve the proposed Resolution authorizing the Mayor to sign an engagement agreement with the law firm of Ewell, Brown, Blanke & Knight LLP, and any other documents necessary to effectuate such firm's engagement in connection with potential litigation relating to the Bryan Texas Utilities' utility poles and the agreements relating thereto, and further authorizing the filing and prosecution of proceedings to enforce such agreements.
