FACILITY CONDITION ASSESSMENT INTRODUCTION



In the fall of 2018, Bryan Independent School District (BISD) initiated a facility assessment update in order to verify current facility conditions, identify facility needs, guide facility planning and capital investments activities, and to assist in the development of a Long-Range Facilities Master Plan (LRFMP).

Facility assessments are essential to the long-term stewardship of facility assets because the information obtained during the assessment process is utilized to maximize the functionality, value, and useful life of BISD's educational and support facilities.

Additionally, facility assessments are also a core component of the long-range facility master planning process because assessment results are leveraged to evaluate both the adequacy and equity of existing facilities; determine future program feasibility; identify imminent facility needs; inform decisions regarding reinvestment, repair and replacement; and for developing and refining refine budgets and capital improvement plans.

The "Bryan Independent School District Facility Condition Assessment Update" report drafted by PBK in collaboration with and on behalf of BISD, provides a summary of the assessment findings and recommendations.

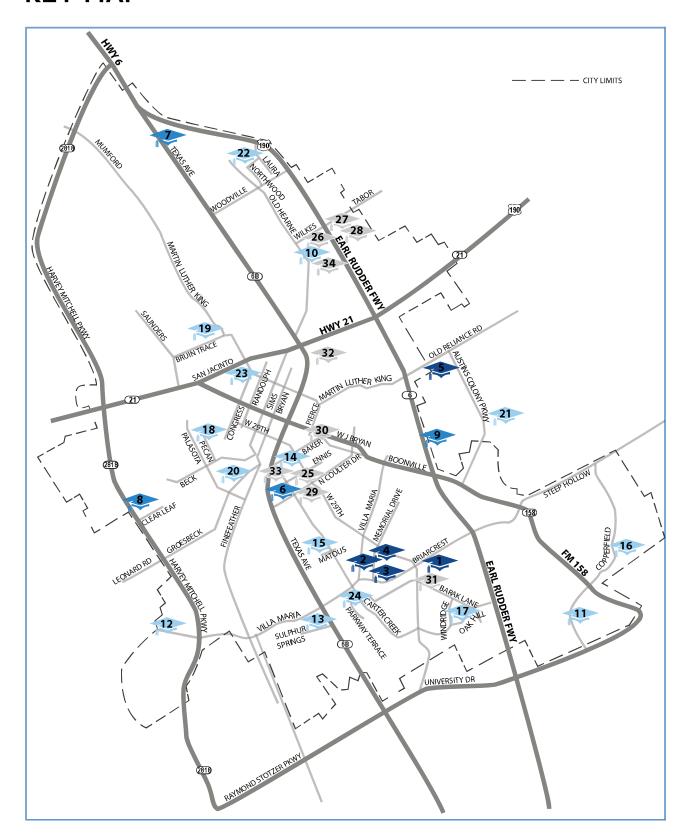
BY DEFINITION

A facility condition assessment is a comprehensive, systematic evaluation of existing conditions for a facility or group of facilities. It involves examination and review of the interior and exterior conditions at each designated campus or site in order to assess current-state conditions and anticipated remaining useful life of buildings, systems and component systems.

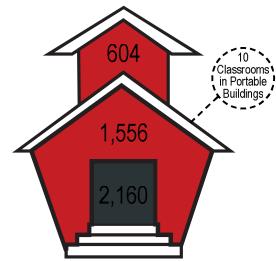

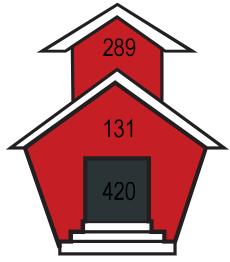

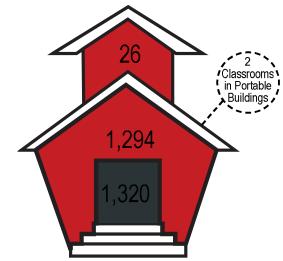

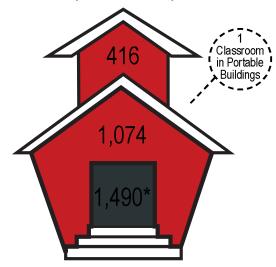

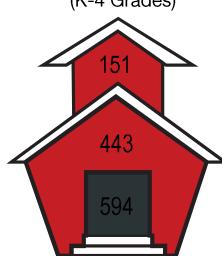
