## **Guidance and Counseling In CSISD - Overview**

#### What does Guidance and Counselingmean?

It refers to the services and programs that promote

- personal
- educational
- career development

The role of school psychologist and guidance counselor are often confused, but they have very different functions within a school.

- School psychologists focus on mental health services for Special Education students
- Guidance counselors provide more academically focused services.



#### **Mental Health Counselors**

School Guidance Counselors are supported by the districts 2 Mental Health Counselor's.

We have 2 Mental Health Counselor's district wide: They are available, on call, to support the guidance counselors with students and/or families in crisis.

- One is assigned to grades 7 to 12
- One is assigned to grades pre-k to 6

New this year: CSISD has started allowing Private Practice Counselors to come into the schools and do private counseling during the school day. Each Counselor has a background check and is trained on the school rules before being allowed to come into the schools. This is carefully monitored, and billing is between the parent and the family.

### Four Components of a Comprehensive School Counseling Program As recommended by TEA

		<b>Elem/Interm level</b>	Middle and HS
1.	<b>Guidance Curriculum</b>	35-45%	<b>15-25%</b>
2.	Individual Planning	<b>30-40%</b>	25-35%
3.	<b>Responsive Services</b>	<b>5-10%</b>	25-35%
4.	System Support	<b>10-15%</b>	<b>15-20%</b>



#### **Guidance Curriculum**

Counselors provide guidance content in a systematic way to all students through classroom/or small group activities.

<u>Purpose:</u> awareness, skill development, and application needed for the following 3 development areas:

- 1. Learning to live
- 2. Learning to learn
- 3. Learning to work

<u>Issues Addressed:</u> Self confidence, motivation to achieve, decision making, goal setting, planning, problem solving skills, interpersonal effectiveness, communication skills, cross-cultural effectiveness and responsible behavior

**Counselor Role:** Guidance Consultation, program implementation, facilitation



## **Individual Planning**

Assists students in monitoring and understanding their development for the next-step decisions.

**Purpose:** Student planning and goal setting

#### **Issues Addressed:**

- <u>Personal/Social</u> Development of healthy self concept, of both short and long term goals
- <u>Academic</u> Acquisitions of study skills, awareness of educational opportunities, appropriate course selection, lifelong learning and utilization of test scores
- <u>Career</u> Knowledge of career opportunities, of occupational training, of labor market information and development of education/career path

**Counselor Role:** Guidance, Consultation, Assessment, Placement



### **Responsive Services**

Addresses the immediate concerns of students

**Purpose:** Prevention, Intervention

#### **Issues Addressed:**

- <u>Personal/Social</u> Relationships, abuse, grief, loss, death, substance abuse, family problems/concerns, coping skills
- <u>Academic</u> Tardiness, absences and truancy, school and classroom conduct, dropout prevention

**Counselor Role:** Counseling, Consultation, Coordination, Referral



## **System Support**

Includes program and staff support activities and services

**Purpose:** Program delivery and support

#### **Issues Addressed:**

Guidance program development, Parent education, Teacher/administrator consultation, Staff development for educators, School improvement planning, Counselor professional development, Research and publishing, Community outreach, Public relations, Funding and budget

**<u>Counselor Role:</u>** Program management, Consultation, Coordination



## **CSISD** Guidance Counselor Staffing

Elementary Schools 1 counselor per school – 600 plus students

Intermediate Schools 1 counselor per school – 700 to 750 students

Middle Schools 1 counselor per school – 700 plus students

Comp High Schools 4 counselors per school – 500 students

College View 1 dean of students – 80 students

At Large 2 LPC's (licensed professional counselor) on call to support schools/head start



## How do we spend our time in CSISD?

#### **Elementary/Intermediate** Middle School/High School

•	Guidance curriculum	<b>20-45% (35-45%)</b>	5% (15-25%)
•	Responsive services	10-40% <mark>(30-40%)</mark>	30-45%(25-35%)
•	Individual planning	10-35% <mark>(5-10%)</mark>	30-45% (25-35%)
•	System support	10-45% <b>(10-15%)</b>	10-20% (15-20%)

Other duties include: Coordination of Testing, 504 and RTI



## Middle and High School required activities

#### Required by law to cover:

- Dating violence
- Bullying
- AED/CPR experience not certification
- How to interact with a police officer

#### Some campuses run guidance groups in the following areas:

- Death of a loved one
- Parent's divorce
- Substance abuse/smokingsecession
- Academic troubles
- Self concept
- Support for those with a parent deployed or incarcerated



#### All Counselors cover

#### **Staff trainings in:**

- Bullying
- Child abuse recognition
- Scheduling
- Dating Violence
- Positive interactions with police officers
- AED/CPR experience
- Data disaggregation and interpretation
- Student academic assistance/504, special education, ESL (modification of lessons & support)

## **Program Challenges**

#### **Student ratios:**

CSISD averages 1 counselor for every 500 to 700 students - 250 to 350 recommended by TEA

TIME to meet the individual needs of students and families and to plan guidance programs

**Emotional/academic aftermath of Covid-19** 

State-mandated testing responsibilities 504 coordination / RTI Master schedule development

#### Alternative options for students:

- testing out
- Homeschooling/virtual school network/online programs/correspondence courses
