Dear Bryan ISD Parents and Guardians,

After listening to feedback from you, our teachers, staff, administrators, and local health officials, the Bryan ISD Board of Trustees today approved changes to the <u>2020-2021 school calendar</u>.

Here are the primary changes:

- The first day of school is now Thursday, August 20 to give teachers more time to prepare their classrooms.
- We will have an early release on most Wednesdays to allow for a midweek additional, thorough cleaning of our schools in addition to daily cleaning.
- We are considering switching to a block schedule format in grades 7-12 to reduce the number of times students change classrooms. (You will receive more information from your principal if you have a secondary student).

The times for early release will be:

• High School: 12:50 p.m.

• Middle School: 12:55 p.m.

• Intermediate School: 2:20 p.m.

• Elementary School: 2:10 p.m.

We've staggered the early release times like this so if you have older children, they can be home first to help take care of elementary students. AlphaBest will also offer after school care for students on early release days following Bryan ISD health guidelines. We are working to move out of ambiguity and into action and our team will remain dedicated to assisting you and your children.
