### CONDITIONS OF COMMUNITY SUPERVISION


On November 30, 2020, you are granted community supervision for a period of Ten (10) Years for the offense of Manslaughter. It is the order of the Court that you abide by the following conditions of community supervision:

- (1) Commit no offense against the laws of this State or of any other State or of the United States.
- (2) Avoid injurious or vicious habits.
- (3) Avoid persons or places of disreputable or harmful character, including any person, other than a family member of the defendant, who is an active member of a criminal street gang.
- (4) Report to the supervision officer/aide as directed by the Judge or supervision officer/aide and obey all rules and regulations of the Community Supervision and Corrections Department (CSCD).
- (5) Permit the supervision officer/aide to visit you at your home or elsewhere.
- (6) Work faithfully at suitable employment to the extent possible.
- (7) Do not leave the State of Texas without written permission from the supervision officer/aide.
- (8) Pay to the Brazos County Collections Department the following as directed:
  - \$575.00 court costs.
  - \$2,500.00 fine.
  - \$0.00 attorney fee.
- (9) Support your legal dependents.
- (10) Perform 200 hours of community service as referred by the supervision officer/aide.
  - Complete at least 10 hours each month until all hours have been completed.
  - Provide proof of completion.
- (11) Submit to testing for alcohol and controlled substances as directed.
  - Pay the costs of the testing.
  - Do not alter or attempt to alter the test results.
- (12) Do not use alcohol.
- (13) Do not go on any premises or be employed by any business where the sale of alcoholic beverages is the main source of revenue.
- (14) Do not use any controlled substance, dangerous drug, or prescription drug unless specifically prescribed to you by a licensed physician for a legitimate medical purpose.
  - If you are prescribed any medication, provide a copy of the prescription.
  - If you take any over-the-counter medicine, provide proof of purchase.
- (15) Submit to screenings, assessments, and/or evaluations as directed.
  - Pay the costs of the screenings, assessments, and evaluations.
- (16) Successfully complete any recommended classes, programs, and/or treatment as you are instructed.
  - Pay the costs of the classes, programs, and/or treatment.
  - Provide proof of successful completion.
- (17) Submit a DNA specimen as directed.
- (18) Notify the community supervision officer/aide of any contact with law enforcement within 48 hours.
- (19) Report any change in your address to the supervision officer/aide at least 48 hours before moving.
- (20) Report any change in your marital status to the supervision officer/aide at least 48 hours before the change.
- (21) Report any change in your employment to the supervision officer/aide within 48 hours of the change.

- (22) Execute a waiver of extradition.
- (23) Do not possess or attempt to purchase any firearm or weapon.
- (24) Pay the following fees to the Brazos County CSCD:
  - \$60.00 monthly reimbursement fee.
    - Your first month's payment is due immediately, then thereafter on the 1<sup>st</sup> of each month.
  - \$20.00 crime stoppers fee.
    - Payment in full is due immediately.
  - \$10.00 screening fee.
    - Payment in full is due immediately.
  - \$2.00 monthly transaction fee.
    - Payment is due at the time of payment.
- (28) Serve 75 days in the Brazos County Detention Center per jail order.
- (61) Within 30 days, submit to the supervision officer/aide a letter of apology to the families of Maria Palomares, Julian Ortega and Zoe Fletcher.
- (73) The defendant will not receive any traffic citations for speeding.
