



Overview


- Addressing on-street parking congestion in residential neighborhoods during major events
- Generate revenue to assist with covering City's game day operational costs
- Generate funds to be used for the benefit of the neighborhoods impacted by gameday
- Only where there is existing parking this program will not create additional on-street parking
- Reminder that the street is a public facility and the space in front of a home is NOT controlled by the property owner/renter.






Southside and Redmond

Public Engagement

- Survey available through Tuesday, August 24th at 8:00 a.m.
- Virtual Public Meeting Monday, August 23rd at 6:00 p.m.
- Results of the survey:
 - (1) Exemptions: No Exemptions: 3.9%, 1 Exemption: 6.2%; 3 Exemptions: 36%; Other: 54%
 - (2) Revenue used for reinvestment: Yes: 88.3% No: 11.7%
 - (3) Reinvestment Categories:
 - Street Maintenance: 142 or 55.7%
 - Sidewalk & Pedestrian Improvements: 116 or 54.5%
 - Public Safety: 83 or 32.6%
 - Park Enhancement: 81 or 31.8%
 - Street Lighting: 80 or 31.4%

Other: 67 or 26.3% Bike Lanes: 53 or 20.8% Landscaping & Benches: 52 or 20.4% Signage & Wayfinding: 32 or 12.6% Transit Stop Improvements: 20 or 7.8%

Proposed Program

- Delay implementation for neighborhoods outside of Northgate
- Study gameday parking and traffic through 2021, continued public engagement, and further develop the proposed program
- Implement ParkMobile system in Northgate District
- Timeline: 30 60 Days
- Contract with ParkMobile not to exceed \$75,000 for 3 years
