




U.S. Real Gross Domestic Product





FIGURE 1. COLLEGE STATION-BRYAN BUSINESS-CYCLE INDEX





FIGURE 3. UNEMPLOYMENT RATE





Nonfarm Employment and Real Taxable Sale in College Station-Bryan MSA






FIGURE 6. NON-MIGRANT AND MIGRANT INCOMES IN BRAZOS COUNTY AND NATIONALLY

FIGURE 5. EMPLOYMENT BY INDUSTRY IN COLLEGE STATION-BRYAN














