#### **ESSER Programs**

- Support schools in safely reopening and sustaining safe operations of schools.
- Intended to meet the academic, social, emotional, and mental health needs of students resulting from the pandemic.

### ESSER III Grant

Initial Grant Amount: \$28,053,907

May 17, 2021 Board Meeting - Overview and July 19, 2021 Board Meeting - Update

- Authorized by the ARP Act of 2021
- Funds available: 03/13/2020 to 09/30/2024



### ESSER III Grant

Remaining Allocation: \$14,026,954

Total ESSER III: \$42,080,861

- Initial release was scheduled for September.
   Remaining funds just now made available.
- 20% of the grant total is required for instruction
