# RESOLUTION NO.

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BRYAN, TEXAS, ESTABLISHING ATTENDANCE REQUIREMENTS FOR BOARD, COMMITTEE AND COMMISSION MEMBERS; REPEALING RESOLUTION NO. 1641; AND ESTABLISHING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the participation of citizens on City Council appointed boards, committees and commissions is critical to the quality of life in Bryan; and

WHEREAS, regular attendance by board, committee and commission appointees is important for these panels to fulfill their critical rolls;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BRYAN, TEXAS:

### Section 1.

That it is the policy of the City Council that citizen appointees are required to attend board, committee or commission meetings as follows:

Quasi-judicial boards, committees, and commissions – Eighty (80) percent attendance in any given six-month period;

Advisory boards and committees – Sixty-six (66) percent attendance in any given six-month period.

# Section 2.

That staff liaisons working with each board, committee and commission shall be responsible for maintaining a record of attendance and reporting to the City Secretary should an appointee fail to attend as required in Section 1 above. A copy of this resolution shall be included along with appointment letters sent to committee, board or commission appointees.

#### Section 3.

That failure of an appointee to meet the attendance requirements as set out above is grounds for removal unless an exception is granted by the City Council.

## Section 4.

That Resolution No. 1641 adopted on November 23, 1987, concerning appointee attendance is hereby repealed in its entirety.

#### Section 5.

That this resolution shall become effective immediately upon its adoption.
