## Stage 2 – Mandatory Watering Restrictions in effect.

Addresses ending in 1,4,6,7 water Mon/Thurs

Addresses ending in 2,5,8 water Tues/Fri

Addresses ending 0,3,9 and HOA meters water Wed/Sat

Watering to start no earlier than 6 PM and end no later than 4 AM the following morning.

Irrigation by handheld hose, soaker hoses, or drip irrigation systems is permitted at any time on your watering day.

Conserving water is about more than making sure everyone in our system has enough to drink or water their lawn.



Most important, it's about safety. If water storage tanks drain and water pressure falls, it threatens everyone's safety in the event of a fire.

Someone using water outside of the posted schedule isn't just keeping their lawn greener, they're endangering everyone on the system, especially their own home.

The last thing that Wellborn SUD wants to do is issue fines or restrict water flow for non-compliance. But, for the safety of all customers, if there is disregard for watering schedules, there are penalties.

### Penalties for non-compliance:

First violation — written warning.

Second violation — \$250 fine.

Third violation — \$500 and a flow restrictor for 7 days (customer pays installation cost).

Subsequent violations — \$2000 and flow restrictor for 7 days (customer pays installation cost).

Watering schedules are based on usage history, water supplies and other WSUD data. Our schedules also reflect best-practice recommendations for healthy lawns and plants based on scientific research of Texas A&M AgriLife and Texas Master Gardeners.
