**THE PARTIES' AGREED AMENDED FINAL JUDGMENT**

The plaintiff, A.R., sued Brazos County, Texas for civil rights violations. (Docket Entry No. 1). Under Federal Rule of Civil Procedure 68, the County made an offer of judgment in writing on November 15, 2023, to allow A.R. to take judgment against the County in the amount of \$500,000.00 in exchange for a full release of claims. The amount offered included all costs and attorneys' fees accrued to the date of the offer. A.R. accepted the offer of judgment in writing on November 17, 2023, and on the same date filed with the offer, notice of acceptance, and proof of service. (Docket Entry No. 44).

A.R. will recover from the County a total of \$500,000.00, which includes all recoverable costs and attorneys' fees accrued to the date of the offer. A.R. may also recover post-judgment interest on the \$500,000.00, in accordance with 28 U.S.C. § 1961, at the published rate of 5.16% per annum. By agreement of the Parties, the County will pay post-judgment interest calculated from December 20, 2023, forward until the date this judgment is paid.

This final judgment disposes of all Plaintiff's claims asserted in this lawsuit, or which could have been asserted in this lawsuit, against the Defendant arising out of the alleged events upon which this suit is based. Based on the release of claims agreed to by Plaintiff in accepting the Offer

of Judgment, this final judgment also disposes of any and all claims, causes of action, and requests for relief that could have been or could be brought by Plaintiff against any past, current, and future Brazos County employees, agents, representatives, and elected or appointed officials arising out of the alleged events upon which this suit is based, and there will be no separate agreement between the parties.

This is a final judgment.
