
Items 9.4 and 9.5 ETJ Release Petitions



Background

- Purpose of ETJ: To promote and protect the general health, safety, and welfare of persons residing in and adjacent to the municipalities
- City's ETJ boundary extends 5 miles beyond municipal boundary
- Section 42.023 (adopted in 1987) requires the governing body to provide its written consent to reduce its ETJ
- Chapter 42 Subchapter D (adopted in 2023) of the Texas Local Government Code allows landowners to petition the City to be released from its ETJ without action by the City's governing body





Recommendation

- Removal of these properties from the City's ETJ will have a negative effect on the general health, safety and welfare of people residing in and adjacent to the city
- Specifically, there are concerns with administering emergency services to these areas, as well as impacting the orderly subdivision and development of land
- Staff recommends denial of these requests based on Section 42.023
