Existing Policy

- Section 3.5 of Fiscal and Budgetary Policy Statements document
- The Cost Recovery Continuum is applied to all programs and services provided by the Parks and Recreation Department
- No change to the policy philosophy; based on community vs. individual benefit
- Recommendations:
 - Defined service categories
 - Supplemental visual continuum

Maximum: 81% - 100+%

High: 61% - 80%

- Daily Admission

Low 21 – 40% Cost Recovery

High 61 – 80% Cost Recovery

- Intermediate Programs
- Adamson Lagoon Rental Maximum 81 100% Cost Recovery
 - Enterprise Operations, Permits & Rentals









Example: Senior Programs

Current Program

■ Cost Recovery: 10%

■ Subsidy: 90%

■ Fee: \$27 Annually

■ Cost Per Program: \$0.02

Proposed Program

Cost Recovery: Low 21 – 40%

■ Subsidy: 79 – 60%

■ \$55 Annually

Cost Per Program: \$0.03









Cost Differentiation

Resident vs Non-Resident Rates

- Non-Resident fee for rentals and memberships = 20% increase
- Does not include swim passes, swim team or programs



Next Step & Potential Options

Next Step

Analyze FY 23 expenditures to evaluate cost recovery practices

Potential Options

- User fee changes
- Expanded ability to pay / scholarship programs
- Implement Non-Resident rates for swim passes, swim team and programs
- Increase Non-Resident rates to 30% / 50% / 100%
