### Remarks Made during July 23 Court

- > 54 voters over 100 years old
  - 17 voters on suspense (should be gone)
  - 22 voters with same DOB (1/1/1901)
- Group has submitted 700-800 challenges
- 3 duplicate voters with same DOB in the A's
- > 20,457 voters on suspense

## Voters over 100 years old

- > 54 voters over 100 years old
  - 17 voters on suspense (should be gone)
  - 22 voters with same DOB (1/1/1901)
- > Prior to Help America Vote Act in 2002
- > 22 voters with same DOB
  - 15 have no voting history
  - 4 on suspense
  - 102 year old voter voted in person in the Primary

### Group has submitted 700-800 Challenges

- Received 608 challenges to voter's registration on grounds of residency
- > 433 have been rejected due to Affidavit lacking required information
- > 2 rejected for no cause (voter address RV Park)
- > 13 voters were already on suspense
- > 5 had more recent information/update

## Grounds to Challenge a voter's registration for residency

Texas Election Code Section 16.092. SWORN STATEMENT REQUIRED.

A voter desiring to challenge a registration must file with the registrar a sworn statement of the grounds for the challenge that:

- (1) identifies the voter whose registration is being challenged; and
- (2) states a specific qualification for registration that the challenged voter has not met based on the public knowledge of the voter designing to challenge the registration.

# To be valid a challenge has to meet the following requirements: 1. Must have an original signature.

- 1. Must have an original signature.
- 2. Must be signed in front of a notary public or similar official.
- 3. Must establish that the requestor is a registered voter in Brazos County.
- 4. Must be based on personal knowledge and not hearsay.

# 20,457 voters on Suspense How does a voter get on the Suspense List? > Mass Mail Returned Mail > Jury Services > Challenge

#### Impact if Cancelled erroneously

- > Disinfranchised voters
  - No longer eligible for Limited Ballot
  - Student away for college
  - Voter relocating for work but still has residence here
  - Elderly who live in assisted living or nursing home

## January 1 – July 25, 2024

- > 6,174 new voters
- > 4,143 address changes (2,227 address confirmations)
- > 635 name changes
- > 122 rejected applications
- > 4,513 cancellations
