

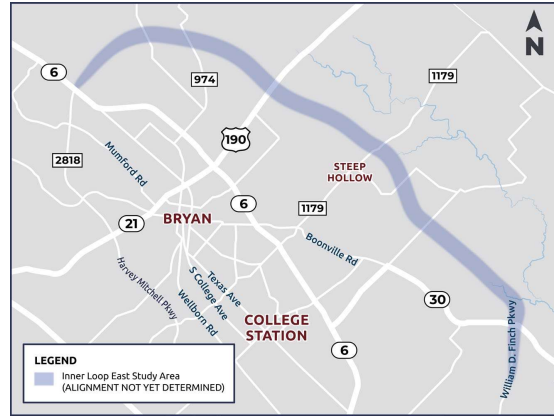
Inner Loop East



Background

Brazos County, in partnership with the Texas Department of Transportation, and the cities of Bryan and College Station, is studying the feasibility of a new roadway that would loop the eastern areas of Bryan and College Station. This new roadway would enhance local and regional connectivity and is part of a continued effort to improve transportation in the community.

The proposed new alignment would connect at SH 6 east of FM 2818 in Bryan, cross SH 30 south of Elmo Weedon Road, and connect with William D Fitch Parkway in College Station.



The project is funded through Brazos County's voter approved Transportation Road Improvement Bond Program (TRIP) 2022 bond.

Why is the Brazos County Inner Loop East Needed?

Existing travel options for residents in Brazos County and the cities of Bryan and College Station are limited causing major congestion and delays for drivers. With the current and expected development in Bryan coupled with the planned growth for Texas A&M in College Station, the need for additional travel options is a top priority to ensure residents and visitors can continue to access their homes, places of work, and favorite destinations with ease.

New Roadway Location and Configuration

Part of this process involves developing options, or alternatives, for the new location of the Inner Loop East. The public will be given opportunities to provide input and share their knowledge with the project team as alternatives are evaluated. The preferred alternative will be selected based on technical evaluations and community input.

While the County is still working to identify the most feasible location for the new Inner Loop around Bryan and College Station, the project team is working to develop a roadway configuration that would provide efficient travel options for all modes of travel.

The roadway would be constructed in phases and additional lanes could be added as the travel demand increases.
