#### **Brief History**

- Circa 1980 to August 31, 2011: Brazos Animal Shelter (BAS)
- 2005: Animal Control went under the direction of BPD
- September 1, 2011: Bryan Animal Center (BAC) Opens
- October 18, 2011: Animal Center Advisory Committee (ACAC) meets
- May 2012: Animal Control Officers report to BAC and Bryan Animal Services is established

#### Council Workshop

- March 27, 2018 (Feasibility Study)
- September 5, 2023 (Animal Center Update)
- July 9, 2024 (CIP Presentation)

### 2024 Bryan Animal Services

- Visitors: ~9,000 guest per year at the BAC
- Save Rate: 69%
- Largest pool of volunteers in the City

   3,000 new volunteers applied this past year
   Since 2015 over 31,000 volunteer hours donated
- FY24 Animal Intake: 1,361
- 667 FRTO: pets returned to owners in field (Animal Control Officers)
- Since 2021: Bryan Animal Services has provided <u>FREE</u> microchips, rabies vaccinations, and sterilizations to Bryan residents:
  - 1,537 vaccinations, 1,373 microchips, and 1,196 sterilizations

## **Purpose of Feasibility Study**

- Analyze and evaluate existing facility
- Determine needs for a future facility
- Review potential sites for a new facility
- Develop conceptual design for a new facility

## Feasibility Study: Existing Shelter Analysis

- More animal habitats are needed
- Spaces are used for multiple purposes, compromising primary functions
- Many program needs do not have specifically designated space
- Rooms are used as passageways for unrelated functions
- Facility needs improved accessibility
- Public access to animal habitats and comingled air creates potential for disease to spread


# Feasibility Study: Habitat Capacities

Dog Holding		12
Dog Adoption	29	13
Puppy Adoption		10
<b>Total Dog Habitats</b>	41	60
Cat Isolation	6	10
Cat Quarantine	6	10
Cat Intake Cat Holding	8	30
Cat Adoption	31	30
Total Cat Habitats	51	80



#### **Sizing Factors**

- Average 60/40 ratio of dog/cat intake varies from month to month; both sized to accommodate the larger percentage
- Intake during peak months is typically 40% over monthly average
- Number of cat habitats over-sized in relation to small size, economy, and flexibility of cages



# Building Site, Funding, and Design


- Location:

- FY26 CIP Bond Funds:



- Create a bid for a design/build contract
  - Proposal process Spring 2025
    Projected building design plans complete 2025 (tentative)
    Projected construction to begin 2026

#### SCHEMATIC BUILDING ELEVATIONS






WEST BUILDING ELEVATION (FROM PUBLIC PARKING)


