Long-term Community-based Opioid Recovery Effort (CORE) Grants

Purpose

The Opioid Abatement Fund Council (OAFc) seeks to empower local organizations to address the opioid crisis at a grassroots level. The Long-term CORE grant funding is directly broken out and allocated among the 20 Regional Healthcare Partnership (RHP) regions for projects meeting the criteria for Council-approved strategies in the following two OAFc-designated categories: Treatment and Coordination of Care; and Recovery Support Services.

Funding Amount & Eligibility

Available Funding:

\$50,000,000 across all regions for projects lasting 1-3 years. Up to \$250,000 per year or 50 percent of the total funds available in a RHP region.

OAFc Funding Categories:

Eligible strategies outlined in the Notice of Funding Availability (NOFA) fall under two OAFc-designated categories:

- Treatment and Coordination of Care
- Recovery Support Services

Eligible Applicants:

State agencies and political subdivisions of the State of Texas (including cities, counties, school districts, state universities, and special districts). Any other entity that engages in business in Texas in accordance with **34 TAC 16.205**. **All other eligibility requirements are outlined in the NOFA.**

Apply Now

Read the entire NOFA and **complete an application via the OAFc's grant management system.**

Applicants may apply for multiple regions but must submit separate applications.

Deadline: Feb. 10, 2026, at 2 p.m. CT.
Late applications will not be accepted.

Selection Process: Multi-stage review including independent peer review. Final awards are determined by the OAFc.

The Long-term CORE grant funding is directly broken out and allocated among the 20 Regional Healthcare Partnership (RHP) regions [comptroller.texas.gov/programs/opioid-council/docs/regional_healthcare_partnership_map.pdf] for projects meeting the criteria for council-approved strategies in the following two OAFC-designated categories: Treatment and Coordination of Care; and Recovery Support Services.

By providing funding in RHP regions, the CORE grants support evidence-based, community-driven solutions that ultimately work to improve the lives of individuals and families affected by the opioid crisis across Texas.

Awards

The OAFB voted on June 16, 2026, to award 2025 Long-term CORE grants to the following entities in each Regional Healthcare

Partnership (RHP) region. Additionally, the table below includes the OAF-C category most closely aligned with each grant project.
